REPORT ON DEBATE COMPETITION "DO I NEED A TEACHER WHEN I HAVE GOOGLE?" 23rd DECEMBER 2022

The Debate Competition on the theme "Do I Need a Teacher When I Have Google?" was held on December 23rd, 2022, at J.B. Institute of Engineering and Technology. The participants were second-year students, and the Chief Guests were Major General Prof. Dr. S. S. DASAKA, SM, VSM (Retd.), CEO, J.B. Group of Educational Institutions and Dr. J. Ms. SHADA MANOGNA from the Department of Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning won the first prize, while Mr. THARUN KUMAR CHIRRA from the Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering won the second prize. Students were awarded with books.


